Top 10 ATAR Students

The table below details the top 10 Sacred Heart students in 2016 based on their TEA (Tertiary Entrance Aggregate). The TEA is calculated by adding the student's final scaled marks for his/her best four subjects. A student's ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank) is derived from the student's TEA. The highest possible ATAR score is 99.95. An ATAR of 99.00 indicates the student has performed in the top 1% of the State. In 2016, 30 students scored an ATAR of 95 or higher - placing these students in the top 5% of the state. This compared with 25 students in 2015. It is outstanding to have so many students achieve such a high TEA/ATAR result.
