Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE)

Breadth and Depth

- At least 20 Units across Year 11 and 12 (10 Units must be studied in Year 12)
- Minimum 4 units of English or Literature across Year 11 and 12
- ONE List A & ONE List B subject in Year 12.

Achievement Standard

• 'C' grades for 14 units (or 7 whole year length subjects) across Years 11 & 12 with 'C' grades for 6 units (or 3 whole year length subjects) in Year 12.

Literacy and Numeracy Standard

- Four English or Literature units in total across Year 11 and 12
- Must meet the minimum literacy and numeracy standard – NAPLAN / OLNA

Minimum of five whole year subjects in Year 12 to achieve WACE



To achieve WACE, a student must study one subject from List A and one subject from List B



A Certificate II is worth the equivalent of one subject in Year 11 and one subject in Year 12 (4 units, 4 'C' grades)



A Certificate III is worth the equivalent of one subject in Year 11 and two subjects in Year 12 (6 units, 6 'C' grades)



A Certificate IV is worth the equivalent of one subject in Year 11 and two subjects in Year 12 (6 units, 6 'C' grades)

Certificate of Merit = 150-189 points Certificate of Distinction = 190-200 points



Change is still possible!

If you achieved low 'C' grades or 'D' grades in Year 11 ATAR subjects, you can still make changes to achieve WACE and to get to your preferred post-school destination

You could

- Study General subjects instead of ATAR subjects *
- Study fewer ATAR subjects
- Take a CareerLink Pathway and study a Certificate IV that will give you a chance of entry into several University courses *
- Study five subjects instead of six to reduce your workload and have a study period each day



ATARs from all states are equivalent

TEA & ATAR

- Tertiary Entrance Aggregate (TEA) is the sum of the best four final scaled scores
- TEA is converted to an Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank (ATAR).

How do you get a 10% Bonus?

10% of scaled score for subject is added to Tertiary Entrance Aggregate of best four scaled scores. (e.g. 60% for Methods equates to 6 additional marks added to TEA).

Bonus is added regardless of whether course is in best four subjects!

STANDARDISED

Differences in difficulty of examination from year to year

MODERATED

Differences in assessment from school to school

SCALED

Differences in difficulty from subject to subject.

Ensures no disadvantage in taking a difficult subject.
