

## **2017 YEAR 12 RESULTS**

Our Year 12 Class of 2017 achieved great success in the ATAR Examinations. Sacred Heart has established a culture of high achievement over a long period of time.

### **SCHOOL CURRICULUM AND STANDARDS AUTHORITY AWARDS**

A record number of Sacred Heart students achieved Awards from the School Curriculum and Standards Authority. The recipients of School Curriculum and Standards Authority Awards are as follows:

#### **General Exhibition**

Eva Male

General Exhibitions are awarded to the 50 eligible students with the highest WACE award scores based on the average of five equated examination scores in ATAR courses with at least two from each of the humanities/social sciences list and the mathematics/science list.

#### **Subject Exhibition**

Eva Male – Psychology

Subject Exhibitions are awarded to the top student obtaining the highest examination mark in an ATAR course.

#### **Subject Certificate of Excellence**

Kate Hearn – Human Biology

Eva Male – Psychology

Chloe Sullivan – Human Biology

Certificates of Excellence are awarded to students who are in the top 0.5 per cent of candidates based on the examination mark or the top two candidates (whichever is greater) in an ATAR course.

### **CERTIFICATES OF DISTINCTION AND CERTIFICATES OF MERIT**

In Years 11 and 12, students accumulate points based on the grades they achieve for each semester unit completed. A Certificate of Distinction is awarded to each eligible student who, in their last three consecutive years of senior secondary WACE enrolment, achieves 190-200 points. A Certificate of Merit is awarded to each eligible student who, in their last three consecutive years of senior secondary WACE enrolment, achieves: 150-189 points.

### Top 10 ATAR Students

The table below details the top 10 Sacred Heart students in 2017 based on their Tertiary Entrance Aggregate (TEA). The TEA is calculated by adding the student's final scaled marks for his/her best four subjects. A student's ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank) is derived from the student's TEA. The highest possible ATAR score is 99.95. An ATAR of 99.00 indicates the student has performed in the top 1% of the State. In 2017, 29 students scored an ATAR of 95 or higher - placing these students in the top 5% of the state. It is outstanding to have so many students achieve such a high TEA/ATAR result.
